Dear Sir, I find that the State of Maryland has
acceded to the association and when this comes officially to
Congress New Hampshire can be no longer represented
by one member. Virginia has given to Congress sixty mil-
lion Acres of land on the west side of Ohio River. —

General Arnold has left the upper part of
Virginia and fallen down the River. The southern
Army remains in its station as does the British in
that quarter. — The plan of finance as also the deter-
mination of the affair of Mr Delatour have been delay-
ed for many reasons one of which was my being sent
to quiet the disturbances in the Pennsylvania line
I hope they both will be completed in a short time
